



## Porcelain Paver Care and Maintenance

Outdoor porcelain pavers require minimal maintenance, typically involving regular sweeping to remove debris and seasonal cleaning with warm water, a mild detergent, or a specialized porcelain cleaner. While they are stain-resistant and do not require sealing, they can be pressure washed (low setting) to remove stubborn dirt, ensuring the joints are not damaged.

### Key Care and Maintenance Guidelines

- **Routine Cleaning:** Regularly brush or sweep to remove dirt, leaves, and debris, preventing abrasive wear.
- **Washing:** Use a soft mop, cloth, or brush with water and a neutral detergent, then rinse thoroughly with clean water to prevent residue.
- **Stain Removal:** Clean spills promptly with a mild, acid-free detergent. For stubborn stains, use a specialized porcelain cleaner or a stiff-bristled brush.
- **Pressure Washing:** Use a pressure washer on a low-to-medium setting to clean, angling the lance carefully to avoid damaging joints.
- **What to Avoid:** Do not use wax, sealant, or impregnating products, as they are not needed and can damage the surface. Avoid steel wool, wire brushes, and harsh, abrasive chemicals.
- **Joint Care:** Regularly inspect and clean joints, as moss or weeds can grow, though less frequently than on concrete.
