Building Permit Received for HAWA! (Shipley Health & Wellness Annex)


What if we had 6500 sq. ft. more space to offer you more opportunities for Friendship, Recreation, and Education? Well, we will soon! Your Health & Wellness Annex will have offices, a conference/classroom, a beautiful patio for gatherings, events, or relaxing, and two major programming areas that will greatly expand Shipley Center's activity offerings.

After a 3+ year struggle, and over \$135,000 in permit and utility hook-up fees, etc., we have finally received our site and building permits from the City of Sequim Planning Department. Bidding packets including all plans and specs are being sent out by January 19 to five local contractors with experience building commercial structures with energy-saving SIPS panel walls and ceilings. The bidding process should take about 4 to 5 weeks.

Your Building Committee will then go over the bids, interview the finalists and choose a contractor, perhaps by sometime in March. We will then set a date for a ground-breaking and let you know the start date for construction!

Demonstration Kitchen and Classroom

Have fun watching cooking demonstrations that illustrate healthy food options and nutritional concepts. Experience hands-on learning that will make a difference in your overall health and well-being. Sessions will be taught by qualified cooks, registered dieticians, physicians, health educators, local restaurant owners, and perhaps a local celebrity now and then! When not used for food-related classes, the classroom area will be used for other activities and how-to classes of interest to our members.



Spotlight on . . . Karen Hanson

"All in the Family!" When one board member has served his term, he is replaced by his spouse! We said "Goodbye" to Joel Hanson in 2023, when his term ended, and welcomed his wife, **Karen Hanson**, this year, for the start of her three-year term on Shipley's Board of Directors. As our previous Treasurer has left the board, we are particularly pleased because Karen has the financial acumen necessary for the Treasurer position!

The Early Years

Karen's Dad, a career Air Force officer, was stationed in Lincoln, Nebraska, when Karen was born; but only three months later, it was off to Fairbanks Alaska, where her brother was later born. Then, being an *Air Force Brat* (I know there are *Army Brats* . . . so am thinking this also applies to the other services!), the family moved to Alabama; then to Ft. Bragg, N.C. followed by Shaw AFB, S.C.

When her Dad was deployed for a year to Korea, Karen's family returned to Lincoln, Nebraska, where they had relatives. (Her great-grandparents had settled in Nebraska when they arrived from Czechoslovakia in the 1800's.) A fond memory of that year was attending a *lot* of baseball games with her brother and Mom. Lincoln had a Triple-A team at that time, and her Mom loved the game!

Then, it was "on the road again," to Hamilton AFB (now de-commissioned) in CA; followed by Denver, where Karen graduated from Aurora Central High School.

Young Adult Life

With a vision of being an archaeologist, Karen spent a year at Mesa University in Grand Junction. She met her first husband who was also enrolled there. After marrying, it was back to Denver for a couple of years and on to Fernley, Nevada, near Reno where their eldest son was born; then back to Denver where the younger son was born.

During this time, Karen picked up clerical and secretarial jobs, and worked for several companies; then to OEA Inc., a manufacturer of airbag inflators and initiators. While beginning as a secretary, Karen became interested in "the numbers side of things." The company paid for her to attend college night courses leading up to an accounting degree. Now, with this, she worked her way up to Accounting Manager; then Assistant Controller.

When the company started installing computer systems in the late '80's, that really grabbed Karen's interest! With this new knowledge, she moved on to a position with United Artists Theatres in the Denver area; then after 10 years took a position with Ernst & Young a consulting firm. At this time she was back in night school at Regis University getting her Master's degree in computer systems. From there, she moved on to Highline Corp for a senior consulting job working on implementing payroll and HR software, entailing a lot of travel.

It was in 1988 that Karen started running, joining a track club. It was also how she was to meet her current husband, Joel. They were married in 1988 and, in 2000, they moved to Lake St. Croix Beach, Minnesota. It was a good fit: Joel had been brought up in Minnesota, and Karen loved the area, having done some consulting there. Joel was employed by Barnes & Noble and was able to transfer there, and Highline didn't care where Karen worked as long as she had nearby airport access!

Coming to Sequim

After a period of time living in Texas to be close to Karen's sons and the grandkids, the kids now in their teens, they knew Texas was not the place for their "forever home." In 2015, they retired, bought a 19' trailer, and traveled throughout Florida, Texas, North Dakota, and the Midwest states. Two years later, back to their Minnesota for a brief trip, they thought this was where they would like to live, but Minnesota was way too expensive. The big question: "Where do we want to live now??"

So, deciding on a "Western Swing" trailer-trip through California and up the West Coast, they arrived in Sequim where Joel's brother and wife had lived for the previous five years. They found they *really* liked it here! The area had the water of Minnesota and the mountains of Colorado; it was a nice size, with friendly people. "This looks like we've found "the place!"


Welcome to the Board, Karen. We're excited you'll be around when we get that new building underway—and, hopefully, completed—during your three-year term!







