



After graduation from SMU, it was "off to see the world" . . . a year in Odawara, Japan, Teaching English as a Second Language (TESL) and two years in Cairo, Egypt, for a Master's degree in TESL. (There, the course was called Teaching English as a *Foreign* Language!)

Reba was a Teaching Fellow while working on her Master's degree. During the first year, she lived in a university-provided apartment on Zamalek Island in the Nile River! Living in the Middle East was fascinating at that time, although life as a single woman in Cairo was challenging.

Missing the four seasons, particularly winter, it was back to northern New Mexico for two years, teaching middle school. Reba loved the nearby access to Colorado ski resorts. While never a "great" skier, she hit the slopes as often as possible!

While teaching in northern NM, Reba met her soon-to-be husband,

Rich Renner. He was doing a medical internship in a small town near where she was living. After marrying, and while her husband was in school studying medicine in Michigan, Reba taught middle school there, where their first son was born. After medical school and residency, the Renners headed west.

They spent four years in Colorado, Durango, where son number two was born, and Ft. Collins. They then accepted an opportunity in E. Bremerton in 1989 where Rich, a pediatrician, took a position with Group Health. Reba kept herself busy raising their sons, teaching, and earning a second Master's degree from Antioch, in psychology. She added school counseling courses at City University and spent twenty years serving as a school counselor for Central Kitsap School District in East Bremerton.

After Rich retired in 2010, the family moved to Port Ludlow; then to Port Hadlock . . . then to Los Cruses, NM, for a four-year "Southwestern Adventure." While they enjoyed their time in the warmer climate, Rich could not express his passion for organic gardening in the hot, dry climate. . . so, back to Washington State and Port Hadlock in the fall of 2018, just a year before the COVID pandemic.

Concerned about the state of child mental health during and after the pandemic, Reba began counseling children and youth with Discovery Behavioral Health in Port Townsend. While the work there was rewarding, it was also exhausting. Reba decided she needed to find something a little lighter. A good friend of Kathryn, our *Leo's Café* Chef, during one of their chats, she found out about the Program Director position opening up. Although a new direction for her, it piqued Reba's interest, so she applied . . . and here she is!

While Reba is exploring her new position, Rich, now an organic gardener and avid cyclist, was, on the day of our interview, biking from Port Angeles to Lake Crescent and back! A social activist, Rich lobbies in DC on behalf of an organization called Results, a movement of passionate, committed everyday people . . . using their voices to influence political decisions that will bring an end to poverty.

In her free time, Reba likes to clean and organize! (Need her around *my* house!) She enjoys Books on Tape, particularly detective stories. She'll get going on one author and read all they wrote! Then on to another. She also gets recommendations of current reads from her friends. Pretty much a home-body, travel is mainly to visit their sons—one, a woodworker in Portland, and the other a massage therapist in Virginia—and other relatives. (A particular draw to Virginia is a seven-year-old granddaughter!)

Before leaving the interview, I asked her: Have you any suggestions for any programs you would like to see implemented here?




