

Medicare's Open Enrollment is available until December 7!*

For Medicare beneficiaries in Washington state, this is an important time of year. Open Enrollment – also known as the Annual Election Period – is held each year from October 15 to December 7. During this time, if you are on Medicare:

- You can switch from Original Medicare to a Medicare Advantage plan and vice versa.
- With Original Medicare, you can join, drop or switch a Part D prescription drug plan.
- With a Medicare Advantage plan, you can switch or drop your Medicare Advantage plan.

The Statewide Health Insurance Benefits Advisors **(SHIBA)** program – part of the Office of the Insurance Commissioner - is ready to help with these decisions.

One-on-one help from our local SHIBA volunteers is available at our walk-in, first-come-first-served clinics. Our clinic schedule is available by calling 360-417-8555 or online at https://www.o3a.org/news/events-calendar/.

During open enrollment, our last Shipley Center walk-in clinic will be from 9AM to noon on Tuesday, December 5.

* In the State of Washington, Medigap or Medicare Supplement plans do not have an open enrollment period. There are specific rules that apply to changing or signing up for a Medigap plan.

THE BACK-STORY

Born in Port Townsend, the family moved back and forth between there and Port Angeles, his father working with the phone company. Then came the move to Tacoma and Lynnwood, where Steve graduated from high school. (He was the eldest of five, and his oldest sister, eleven months younger than he, recently moved to Sequim!)

After graduation, Steve moved back to Port Angeles (PA) to live with his grandparents while he attended Peninsula College and worked as a lot boy at Anderson Ford. At age 20, he applied to be a reserve deputy with the Clallam County Sheriff's Office. Not being old enough yet to carry a firearm, he was trained as a Dispatcher. After reaching the age of 21, he spent time as a Deputy, Corrections Officer, and a Records Clerk. After all of this, he determined that Dispatching was his choice career path.

Two years later, when Kim became pregnant, they realized that was not a place where they wanted to raise their child. So, Steve became an Everett Police Dispatcher for two years . . . and then was hired by the city of PA as a Dispatcher. 


