# STEM at Fishburne

## Courses

### 3D Model and Design

- Learn concepts and applications used for 3D modeling, design, and fabrication on a 3D printer (CAD and CAM).
- This course is application or project-based
- Programming (coding), physics, and mathematics are used regularly

### Introduction to Coding and Computer Science

- Develop a deeper understanding of computer system architecture and more sophisticated programming skills using Python.
- Emphasize Proper coding habits and well-designed algorithms
- Offers opportunities for earning free micro-credentials and certificates!

### IT Fundamentals and Technology Skills

- Cultivate understanding of common computer applications and IT literacy.
- Introduces computer programming/coding and basic electronic concepts needed for basic PC maintenance and repair.
- Hands on activities involve the disassembly and assembly of a PC
- Intro to Blender develops an understanding of simple games & animations.

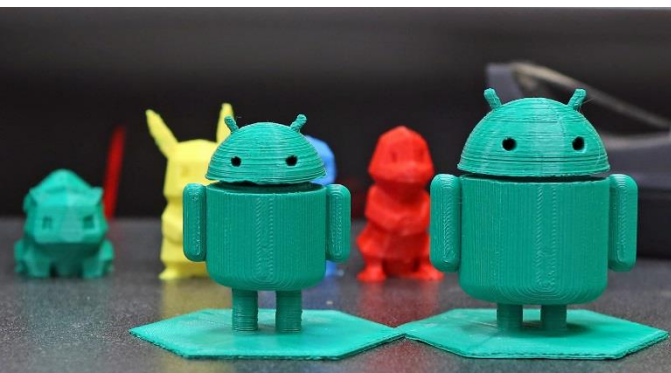
### Computer Applications

- Use common consumer-based personal computer applications that run in the Windows and Linux operating systems.
- Applications include: Microsoft Office Suite, OpenOffice, LibreOffice, Flogarithm, and Rapid Typing.

### Advanced Technology

- Introduction to computer logic using: Python, JavaScript, and MIT Scratch
- 3-D modelling and design using CAD and a 3-D printer for CAM.
- Use Unity 3D to design 3D virtual reality programs for Android systems

## Dual Enrollment Courses

### ITE 119: Information System Literacy

- Earn college credit through Blue Ridge Community College!
- Instruction directed towards office suites, word processing, spreadsheets, presentations, and databases.

### ITE 120: Principles of Information Systems

- Earn college credit through Blue Ridge Community College!
- Overview of computer information systems fundamentals
- Emphasis on business application of information systems, computer ethics, and personal security with system development.
- Utilizes hands-on component for spreadsheets, databases, and web design applications.

### Introduction to Cyber Security

- A very advanced and multifaceted class, this may be used for vocational certificates, CompTIA Security + Certification Prep, micro certificates, and verified EdX certificates.
- Topics include: Intro. to information security, protection of personal privacy & information, IT security techniques, online safety, legal, ethical, & professional issues in information security & risk management, security technology, intrusion detection & prevention systems; implementing information security; introduction to cyberwarfare and cyberterrorism.

## Professional Certifications

### Basic Computer Technician Training/CompTIA A+ (Part one)

- The first of three courses which prepares cadets to take the recognized CompTIA A+ IT industry certification examinations
- Cadets will receive extensive and intensive classroom instruction in computer systems, troubleshooting, and PC repair.
- Cadets will enroll in PVCC's online Ed2Go course titled "The Basic CompTIA A+ Certification Prep Course."
- Receive a technical certificate of course completion from PVCC
