According to the National Safety Council, home and community deaths are up 74%, and workers are twenty times more likely to be injured off the job than while at work. Safety & Health Magazine estimates that nine out of ten employee deaths occur while away from the job site.

Slips and falls in the home account for approximately eight thousand deaths annually, and more than 150,000 people are injured while mowing the lawn. There are many more statistics from where these came from. The bottom line is, it's important to incorporate safety into your overall lifestyle.

On-the-job safety regulations require employers to provide a safe workplace and equipment. They establish safe operating procedures, provide appropriate personal protective equipment, and require employees receive proper training before working any job task. The employer shouldn't limit a safety attitude to only the work environment. They should take it to the next level and commit to the employee's wellness and quality of life. During training sessions and safety meetings, reinforce the idea to use PPE and safety procedures away from the job site.
