



# NEW YEAR STEWARDSHIP DEVOTIONAL

## Day 1 — A New Year, A Faithful Calling

*Scripture: 1 Corinthians 4:2*

## Day 5 — Generosity as Worship

*Scripture: 2 Corinthians 9:7*

Generosity is worship, not loss. Obedience cultivates trust.

Journal Prompt: How does your generosity reflect what you believe about God's provision?

## Day 6 — Progress, Not Perfection

*Scripture: Philippians 1:6*

Stewardship is a journey. Faithfulness grows through persistence.

Journal Prompt: Where can you extend yourself grace while remaining committed to growth?

## Day 7 — Playing the Long Game of Stewardship

*Scripture: Matthew 25:21*

Stewardship is practiced daily and bears fruit over time.

Journal Prompt: What would it look like to measure success by faithfulness this year?
